

Facilities & Park Boundaries

Enjoy all that Barrington Park District has to offer!

The Barrington Park District has five main parks within its system: Langendorf, Citizens, Ron Beese, Miller, and Columbus. Each has a variety of recreational and fitness opportunities to offer to all our residents.

Fitness & Recreation Center at Langendorf Park

235 Lions Drive

This 37-acre site features a Fitness Center; Recreation Center; Meeting & Community Rooms; Children's Preschool Workshop; Administrative Offices; Aqualusion Aquatic Center; Bash Skate Park; 3 Ball Diamonds; Playground; Tot Lot; 5-hole, par-3 Golf Learning Center; Field House; Picnic Sites and Shelters; 2 Sand Volleyball Courts; Maintenance Facility. Also, cross-country skiing is available during the winter.

Bash Skate Park (Langendorf Park)

The Bash Skate Park is open during construction! Hours are from 9am to 9pm daily (hours are subject to change due to holidays, inclement weather, and building closures). Skate at your own risk; the Bash Skate Park is not supervised. Protective gear is highly recommended (helmets, wrist guards, knee and elbow pads). The Park District is not responsible for accidents, injuries, or lost or stolen items.

Citizens Park

511 Lake Zurich Road, at Route 14

The newest addition to the Park District features 45 acres that include the Pepper Family Treehouse; Jewel Tea Pavilion; John Larkins Bell Gazebo; The Lodge, Robert Soule Amphitheater; the Cuba Marsh Connection Trail; a Playground; Biking/Walking Paths; 4 Tennis Courts; 2 Basketball Courts; 2 Picnic Shelters; and a Maintenance Garage. Cross-country skiing is available.

Winter Ice Skating at Citizens Park

During the winter months, we have ice skating at Citizens Park on the basketball courts. Bring your own skates! Hours are 9:00am-8:00pm Monday through Sunday. Call 847-381-0881 for more information on conditions.

Ron Beese Park

50 Rotary Drive (Off Cornell Avenue)

This 80-acre park features a Teams Challenge Course; Hiking Trails; Garden Plots; Cross-Country Ski Trails; Nature Study Areas; Playground Area; 6 Soccer Fields; 2 Softball Fields; 1 picnic shelter.

Columbus Park

133 Lakeshore Drive (Fairhaven Subdivision)

The 12-acre Columbus Park site features a 5-acre park with an open play area and a playground.

Miller Park

Lincoln & Summit Streets

This 8-acre park includes a handicap-accessible playground area and the Roy Wilmering Scout Cabin (426 E. Russell Street).

Park District Boundaries

When determining the fees for a particular class, you must first determine whether you are "in district" or "out of district." In-District residents are those who reside within the Barrington Park District boundaries and who pay taxes to the Barrington Park District. All others are out of district.

Important: Not all Village of Barrington residents are within the Barrington Park District boundaries and therefore require the out-of-district rates. Please see the neighborhood lists below and check your tax statement to determine your residency status.

In-District Areas

Barrington Meadows, Chateaux Bourne, Chippendale, Eastwood, Fairfield, Fairhaven, Fielding Place, Flint Lake, Fox Point, Glen Acres, Hillside Farms, Village Area, Jewel Park, Lakeview, Lishartke, Park Barrington, Pickwick, Shire Deer Chase (Partial), Shorely Woods, Steeplechase, Tall Trees, The Oaks, Westwood, Wyngate.

Out-of-District Areas

Algonquin, Barrington Hills, Biltmore, Deer Park, Fox River Grove, Hartz Farm Estates, Haverton on the Pond, Hawthorn Woods, Heritage Hills, Inverness, Kildeer, Lake Barrington, Lake Zurich, Long Grove, North Barrington, Port Barrington, Shady Hill, South Barrington, Timberlake, Tower Lakes.

SPECIAL NOTE: If you live in the Villages of North Barrington, Lake Barrington, and Barrington Hills, you may be eligible for special rebates if you sign up for classes in the Barrington Park District. Call your local village to find out about program rebate information.
